EXPORT PRECISION INSTRUMENTS TO SATELLITES;
GET ROLLED PLATE FROM USSR

EXPORT PRECISION INSTRUMENTS -- Berlin, Taegliche Rundschau, 14 Aug 51

Under existing foreign-trade agreements, microscopes and physical measuring instruments are being shipped to China, Poland, Rumania, Bulgaria, and Czechoslovakia by the Potsdam precision and optical industries.

The people-owned Optical Shops are working day and night to complete large research microscopes ordered by China at the Leipzig Spring Fair.

The privately owned Schrader and Company in Babelsberg is working on export orders exclusively. This firm manufactures physical testing instruments for oil and coal research, for shipment to China and other Satellite countries.

TO USE PLATE IN SHIP CONSTRUCTION -- Chemnitz, Volksstimme, 13 Aug 51

At the beginning of August, a large shipment of rolled plate was unloaded by the Soviet steamer Krymov at Rostock harbor. The metal is to be used in the construction of merchant ships for the German Democratic Republic.

EXPORTS TOY TRAINS -- Berlin, Taegliche Rundschau, 16 Aug 51

The RFT Geraetewerk (Radio and Telecommunications Equipment Works) in Chemnitz has completed another of 1,000 electrical toy trains, for Czechoslovakia.

fair were particularly interested in the optical instruments of the Zeiss Works (Jena). Great interest was also shown in dishes and kitchenware made of heat-resistant Jena glass. The products exhibited by the NAGEMA (Food and Beverage Processing Machines) enterprise were examined with great interest.

A machine for shaping 1,600 kilograms of dough into various kinds of bakery goods in 8 hours, and a machine which will produce 10,000 rolls an hour attracted the particular attention of Bratrstvi, the Czechoslovak consumers' cooperative. A machine that produces pharmaceutical tablets at the rate of 24,000 large and 90,000 small tablets an hour also drew attention and was ordered by the Spofa (United Pharmaceutical Plants) enterprise. A newly developed miniature railway, and a superspeed flashgun with a flash duration of 1/5,000 of a second, as well as an 800-watt short-wave transmitter, special radio tubes, and an AC super-heterodyne radio receiver with push-button control, six wave bands and nine stages were also exhibited.
