BACKGROUND AND ORGANIZATION OF THE MINISTRY OF PAPER AND WOOD-PROCESSING INDUSTRY USSR

HISTORICAL DEVELOPMENT OF THE INDUSTRY

In 1925 - 1926, about three fourths of all paper and cardboard and more than four fifths of all paper industry semimanufactures produced in the USSR were put out by the seven large trusts shown below.

The People's Commissariat of Cellulose and Paper Industry USSR became the Ministry of Cellulose and Paper Industry USSR on 15 March 1946.(2)

On 29 July 1948, the Ministries of Cellulose and Paper Industry USSR and Timber Industry USSR were combined into the Ministry of Timber and Paper Industry USSR.(3)

On 16 February 1951, the Ministry of Timber and Paper Industry USBR was divided into the union-republic Ministry of Timber Industry and the all-union Ministry of Paper and Wood-Processing Industry. (4)

> ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE OF PEOPLE'S COMMISSARIAT OF CELLULOSE AND PAPER INDUSTRY USSR, 1940

The most complete available information on the structural organization and functional scope of the People's Commissariat of Cellulose and Paper Industry UUSR, predecessor of the Ministry of Paper and Wood-Processing Industry USSR, is embodied in a decree of the Council of People's Commissars USSR of 15 August 1940. This decree:

Confirmed the following structure of the central apparatus of the People's Commissariat or Cellulose and Paper Industry USER:

All-Union Trust for Repair and Assembly of Equipment and Construction of Cellulose-Paper Industry Enterprises (Soyuzbumstroymontazh); on cost-accounting basis

State Institute for Planning of Cellulose-Paper Enterprises (Giprobum)

Central Scientific Research Institute of the Cellulose-Paper Industry (TSNIIB)

Publishing House "Gosbumizdat"; on cost-accounting basis

- 4. Authorized the People's Commissariat of Cellulose and Paper Industry USSR to organize with the system of Glavbumsbyt an All-Union Timber-Sorting (lesobrakerazhnaya) Office (Soyuzbumles) with local sorting organ.
- 5. Determined that, with respect to enterprises and economic organizations directly subordinate to the People's Commissariat of Cellulose and Paper Industry USSR cost-accounting rules for main administrations of industrial people's commissariats, as established by the 15 July 1936 decree of the Central Executive Committee and the Council of People's Commissars and recorded in Sobraniye Zakonov SSSR, No 43, 1936, p 361, would be applied directly to the People's Commissariat of Cellulose and Paper Industry USSR.
 - 6. Confirmed the local organs of Glavbumsnab shown in Appendix 1.
- 7. Authorized the People's Commissariat of Cellulose and Paper Industry USSR to organize under Glavkarelbumprom a cost-accounting-basis division of supply, without the right to organize under it local offices and agencies. Determined that all operations of supplying Glavkarelbumprom's enterprises through the division should be carried out only through the system of Glavbumsnab.

- 8. Confirmed the local organs of Glavbumsbyt shown in Appendix 2.
- 9. Confirmed the general staff of the administrative apparatus of the People's Commissariat of Cellulose and Paper Industry USSR, consisting of 3,025 persons, including:
- a. In the central apparatus, 1,040 persons -- 792 in administrations and divisions sustained by the state budget and 248 in administrations and divisions on a cost-accounting basis and on special funds
- b. In administrations of union trusts and their offices and departments, $198\ \mathrm{persons}$
 - c. In local organs of Glavbursnab, 899 persons
 - d. In local organs of Glavbumsbyt, 600 persons
- e. In letal state-budget-sustained organs (inspectorates for boiler inspection and transport), 58 persons
- f. In other organizations on a cost-accounting basis or on special funds, i.e., publishing house, auto base, housing administration, rest home, local arbitration offices, and forces (sily) authorized to recruit workers, 230 persons.
