HUNGARY LOSES LAND TO USSR -- New York, Reportok es Hirek Magyarorszagrol, 26 Jan 52

According to the official <u>Hungarian Statistical Yearbook</u>, Hungary's present border is 2,241.6 kilometers long, while in 1948 it was 2,263.6 kilometers. The publication furnishes no explanation for this territorial loss of 22 kilometers.

Without any public notice, a Soviet-Hungarian commission made this "adjustment" on the Soviet-Hungarian border in favor of the USSR.
