Hungary will be represented at the Moscow Economic Conference to be held from 3 to 10 April 1952.

A preparatory committee has been created, headed by Karoly Ott, Minister of Finance. Members of the committee are: Josef Bognar, Minister of Commerce; Bela Blaha, general secretary of the Miners' Union; Aladar Buzagh, Kossuth Prize winner, university professor, and expert on colloid; Janos Csaszar, Deputy Minister of Foreign Trade; Jozsef Fulep, assistant director of Agrimpex, export-import state enterprise for agricultural products; Sandor Gelei, Kossuth Prize winner and university professor; Laszlo Gillemot, Kossuth Prize winner, university professor, and director of the Research Institute of Iron and Metal Products; Jozsef Mekis, general director of the Matyas Rakosi Works; Endre Odze, general secretary of the Chamber of Commerce; Kurt Sedlmayr, Kossuth Prize winner, expert on plant breeding, and head of the Sopronhorpacs state farm; Matild Toth, member of the Council of Trade Unions, and head of the union's central school; Elemer Vadasz, Kossuth Prize winner, university professor, and geologist; and Jozsef Varga, Kossuth Prize winner, university professor, and chemist.

HUNGARY LOSES LAND TO USSR -- New York, Reportok es Hirek Magyarorszagrol, 26 Jan 52

According to the official Hungarian Statistical Yearbook, Hungary's present border is 2,241.6 kilometers long, while in 1948 it was 2,263.6 kilometers. The publication furnishes no explanation for this territorial loss of 22 kilometers.

Without any public notice, a Soviet-Hungarian commission made this "adjustment" on the Soviet-Hungarian border in favor of the USSR.
