The institute works under the administration of the Section for Natural and Medical Sciences of the Yugoslav Academy of Science and Culture in Zagreb.

The Institute of Physics in Ljubljana, Novi Trg 3 and 4, was established in 1947 on the basis of the law governing the Slovenian Academy of Science and Culture.

The basic functions of the institute are to make it possible for recognized scientists to do experimental work on scientific and scientific-technical problems in physics, and on problems involving the practical utilization of results achieved in such work as they apply to the economy, technology, and medicine; and to acquaint young graduate physicists with scientific methods of work in physics.

The institute publishes information regarding its work through the publications of the Slovenian Academy of Science and Culture.

The institute is under the administration of the Mathematics, Physics, and Technical Research Section of the Slovenian Academy of Science and Culture.

Dr. Anton Peterlin, professor at the College of Philosophy in Ljubljana, is administrator of the institute.

The Scientific Council of the institute is composed of Dr. Josip Plemelj, professor at the College of Philosophy in Ljubljana, Dr. Edgr Milan Vidmar, professor at the Technical College in Ljubljana; and Dr. Maks Samec.

Institute for Research in Medicinal Plants of Serbia

The Institute for Research in Medicinal Plants of Serbia, Belgrade, Tadeusa Kosuskog 49, was established by the government of Serbia on 25 May 1948.

The institute has a physical science section, a technology section, and a chemistry laboratory.

The basic functions of the institute are planned and systematic research in and profitable utilization of medicinal plants which grow in Serbia, study and confirmation of medicinal plant areas in Serbia, discovery of possibilities of caring for and developing threatened plant varieties, analysis of medicinal raw materials of plant origin, and issuance of certificates of analyses made.

The institute has published Nase lekovite sirovine (Our Medicinal Raw Materials).

Dr. Jovan Tocakov, docent at the College of Pharmacy in Belgrade, is director of the institute.

Institute of Biology

The Institute of Biology of Bosnia-Herzegovina, Sarajevo, Bulevar Crvene Armije 7, operates on the basis of the law published in the Sluzbeni List, 31 December 1947.

The institute has two botany sections for the study of blossoming and non-blossoming plants, a zoology section for the study of invertebrates, an entomology section, a botanical garden, and a natural history museum.

process educational material on public health, and to develop methods for health
education and apply them.

The institute publishes the periodical Zivot i zdravlje (Life and Health).

Dr Teodor Ilic is director of the institute.

The Scientific Council of the institute is composed of Dr Milivoje Sarvan,
Dr Nedo Zec, Dr Bogdan Zimonjic, Dr Ernest Grin, Dr Milutin Gligic, Dr Milos

Ilic.

State Veterinary Bureau of Bosnia-Herzegovina

The State Veterinary Bureau of Bosnia-Herzegovina, Sarajevo, Bregalnicka
10, operates on the basis of a law effective 12 September 1945.

The bureau has a section for contagious diseases composed of a microbi-
ology laboratory, a serology laboratory, an epizootic department, and a depart-
ment for diseases of feathered animals; a section for "invazionih" [invasive?]
diseases, a section for the protection of the health, work, and production of
domestic animals; a section for increased breeding of domestic livestock com-
posed of a department for eliminating sterility and a department for artificial
insemination; a section for human and animal nourishment; and a physics and
chemistry section composed of toxicology and biochemistry laboratories.

The basic functions of the bureau are to do bacteriology and serology re-
search in livestock contagious and "invazionih" diseases, and to do research in
veterinary medicine.

Dr Josip Jezic is director of the bureau.

Bureau of Epidemiology of Montenegro

The Bureau of Epidemiology of Montenegro operates by decree of the Ministry
of Public Health and Social Security of Montenegro effective 30 March 1949.

The bureau has a bacteriology and serology section with a parasitology de-
partment, a chemistry section, an epidemiology section with a disinfection serv-
ice department, a health education department, and a health statistics depart-
ment.

The basic functions of the institute are to do research in and study cur-
rent sanitation and epidemiology problems in Montenegro, and to take preventive
measures and work to combat infectious diseases.

Dr Djordje Atlas, bacteriologist, is administrator of the bureau.

Serbian Chemical Society

The Serbian Chemical Society, Belgrade, Bulevar Crvene Armije 73, was established in 1897, working mostly in close cooperation with specialists connected with Belgrade University. Since 1945, the society has broadened its functions and included new ones. Its functions are to unite all scientific and professional workers, work on advancing chemical knowledge and popularizing it, and advance its members in theory and practice.

The society works through its sections for popularizing chemical knowledge, teaching, and work with youth.

The society has 243 members and has a branch in Novi Sad.

The society publishes the Glasnik Hemiskog Drustva (Chemical Society Courier) quarterly.

Serbian Biological Society

The Serbian Biological Society, Belgrade, Studentski trg 3, was not an independent society before the war, but was an affiliate of the Paris Biological Society and published information regarding its work in publications of that society which were exclusively in French. The society was completely reorganized and established as the Serbian Biological Society in 1947.

The functions of the society are to gather biological information with the aim of advancing and propagating biological science, aid research in biology, extend the knowledge of biology to the masses, and aid in improving teaching of biology in the schools.

The society works through its teaching, agrobiological, microbiology, phenology, forestry, and work with youth sections

The society has 17 branches located in Novi Sad, Cacak, Nis, Kragujevac, Zajecar, Sabac, Vrsac, Sremski Karlovci, Subotica, Pristina, Svetozarevo, Vranje, Leskovac, Aleksinac, Pec, Cuprija, and Smederevo.

The society publishes the Arhiv biologskih nauka (Archives of Biological Sciences) quarterly, and the popular science monthly Nauka i priroda (Science and Nature), which is the official publication of the natural science associations of Serbia.

The society publishes the Vesnik drustva matematicara i fizicara NR Srbije (Courier of the Association of Mathematicians and Physicists of Serbia) quarterly. The society has published Osnovni pojmovi matematike i fizicarske definicije u srednjoj skoli (Basic Mathematical Concepts and Definitions for Secondary Schools), by A. J. Rimcina; Osam predavanja iz matematice analize (Eight Lectures on Mathematical Analysis), by A. J. Serbian Medical Association

The Serbian Medical Association, Belgrade, Zelene Venac 1, was established in 1872 for Belgrade physicians. After being sharply criticized by the progressive press, the association accepted members from the interior. The association stopped functioning during the occupation, but was reorganized after the liberation and began operating again in 1946.

The functions of the association are to work on advancing health and social well being in cooperation with state establishments and organizations, to foster medical research, cooperate with the Medical College, and work on perfecting the professional training of physicians.

The association works through its ophthalmology, cardiology, rheumatology, stomatology, hygiene, physical culture, pediatrics, social welfare, medical hydrology and climatology, dermatology and venereology, otolaryngology, gynecology and obstetrics, neuropsychiatry, and tuberculosis sections.

The association has 1,562 members and 36 branches, located in Aleksinac, Valjevo, Vranje, Vrnjaska Banja, Vrsac, Zajecar, Zrenjanin, Zemun, Kragujevac, Krusevac, Kraljevo, Kosovska Mitrovica, Kikinda, Leskovac, Nis, Novi Pazar, Pancevo, Pec, Pozarevac, Pruzren, Pristina, Prokuplje, Svilajnac, Senta, Smederevo, Sremska Mitrovica, Svetozarevo, Sombor, Subotica, Titovo Uzice, Cacak, Sabac, Novi Sad, Becej, Backa Palanka, and Piroc.

The association publishes the Srpski arhiv za celokupno lekarstvo (Serbian Archives for the Entire Field of Medicine), which is issued monthly; and publishes from time to time the journal of its branch in Novi Sad, the Medicinski pregled (Medical Survey).

The following have been published by the association since the liberation: Nase prvo iskustvo sa penicilinom (Our First Experience With Penicillin); Bibliografija srpske zdravstvene književnosti od 1872 - 1918 (Bibliography of Serbian Medical Literature From 1872 to 1918), by Dr Riste Jeremic; Bibliografija srpskog arhiva od 1918 - 1941 (Bibliography of Serbian Archives From 1918 to 1941); Najnoviji uspesi terapije s/Unintelligible/ of Academician V. P. Filatova (Newest Successes With the Therapy of Unintelligible of Academician V. P. Filatov); by Dr Dj. Nestic; Diagnosticko-terapeuticki lekarski prirucnik (Diagnostic and Therapeutic Manual for Physicians); and Kirurske lecenje plucne tuberkuloze (Surgical Treatment for Tuberculosis of the Lungs), by Dr Milic Grujic.

Serbian Society for the Study and Prevention of Cancer

The Serbian Society for the Study and Prevention of Cancer, Belgrade, Bulevar Crvene Armije 16, was established in 1927. After the liberation, it renewed its work in 1946.

The functions of the society are to study, treat, and prevent cancer, and to aid in organizing the fight against cancer.

The society has 103 members.

Association of Pharmacists of Serbia

The Association of Pharmacists of Serbia, Belgrade, Vuka Karadzica 7, was established in 1946. It was known as the Serbian Apothecary Society before the war; it was not a scientific society at that time, but a trade organization.

The functions of the association are to unite all pharmacists, help them advance professionally, and cooperate with the administrative agencies of the people in protecting public health.

The association works through its section on professional and ideological work, medicinal plants section, and its section on gathering material for a history of pharmacy for Yugoslav medical bibliography.

The association has 675 members and six branches, located in Kragujevac, Novi Sad, Pozarevac, Nis, Krusevac, and Subotica.

The Croatian Chemical Society has 160 members.

It publishes the Arhiv za kemiiju (Chemistry Archives), which is issued annually.

The functions of the society are to study and advance medical science and practice, study the causes of various diseases and lead the fight against their occurrence and for their prevention, aid the state administration in the organization of the health service, and aid medical teaching in the Medical College in Zagreb.

The society works through the following sections: internal medicine, pediatrics, ophthalmology, roentgenology and radiology, neuropsychiatry, surgical orthopedics, tuberculosis, dermatology and venereology, experimental medicine, hygiene, historical medicine, rheumatology, stomatology, climatology, balneology, physical therapy, gynecology, hematology, work hygiene, microbiology, otolaryngology, and the section for polyclinic physicians.

The society has 1,386 members with 19 branches, located in Bjelovar, Cakovec, Daruvar, Dubrovnik, Karlovac, Glina, Osijek, Slavonski Brod, Ogulin, Pakrac, Pula, Sisak, Split, Sibenik, Rijeka, Zadar, Varazdin, Vitrovnica, and Vukovar.

The society publishes the Liječnicki vijesnik (Medical Courier), which is issued monthly.

The functions of the association are to work on the professional and scientific advancement of physicians, examine and study problems of health service, and try to raise the health level of Slovenia in accordance with the instructions of the Ministry of Public Health.

The association has organized one section to date, in dermatology.

The association has 360 members and seven branches, located in Maribor, Celje, Novo Mesto, Postojna, Brezice, Slovenjgradec, and Jesenice.

The association publishes the Zdravstveni vestnik (Medical Courier) monthly.

The federation publishes the Acta medica Jugoslavica, which is issued in parts and volumes.
