## Naval Pilot at the Red Banner Air Force Academy, Moscow

An article concerning Heroes of the Soviet Union studying at the Red Banner Air Force Academy in Moscow, identified one of them, DIDENKO, as a naval pilot who is outstanding in his studies.

Other Heroes of the Soviet Union identified were Maj KARELIN, a fighter pilot who shot down 13 enemy fighters and 6 bombers during World War II, and who is now in the 2d-year class; Maj FESENKO, who participated in the battles for Berlin; and Officer BAIDIN, a ground-attack pilot who flew more than 200 sorties during the war. "The Designer of Military Equipment"

After paying tribute to the work of tank designers Zh. Ya. KOTIN and A. A. MOROZOV; fighter-aircraft designers A. S. YAKOVIEV, S. A. LOVOCHKIN, and A. I. MIKOYAN; bomber-aircraft designers A. N. TUPOLEV and V. M. PETLYAKOV\*; ground-attack aircraft designer S. V. IL'YUSHIN; artillery and mortar designers V. G. GRABIN, F. F. PETROV, I. I. IVANOV, and B. I. SHAYYRIN; and ship designers Z. A. DERIBIN, F. F. POLUSHKIN, Ye. M. ZYUNOVIDOV, V. M. BURLAKOV, and A. I. MASLOV, the editorial discussed postwar problems in military weapons and equipment designing.

The editorial stated that Soviet scientists and designers, independently and in a very short time, worked out methods for the production and utilization of atomic energy, and created atomic weapons for the defense of the country. The successes achieved in the field of jet aviation were also remarkable, with aircraft of all types being perfected. In the struggle for technical progress in the military field, young cadres capable of independently solving the complex problems of creating various models of combat vehicles, armaments, and equipment have developed under the guidance of experienced designers, and many of them have received high decorations from the government.

However, the editorial stated that all is not well everywhere, as was brought out at the recent All-Union Conference of Industrial Workers, where considerable shortcomings in the work of design agencies (konstruktorskiye byuro), scientific-research institutions, and design institutions (proyektnyye instituty) were revealed. Some design and research organizations are developing new models of some equipment too slowly, are paying insufficient attention have already become obsolete. Some designers do not consider the needs and suggestions of those using the equipment. These shortcomings revealed at the conference when apply to those organizations doing similar work on military equipment.

Some designers continue to use old methods despite the need for a new outlook and opposed to contemporary military equipment, and they do not make use of the litest scientific advancements. Another cause for some shortcomings in the creation of new military equipment is the lack of guidance over the practical work of designers; there are many defects in the planning of their work, and creative initiative is often hampered by the composition and approval of tasks, and by the inspection of machines at various stages of planning.

It is decidedly necessary to improve leadership in design agencies and scientific-research and development institutes in order to assure that workable models of weapons and combat equipment meet the requirements of military missions. Automatic devices, remote-control apparatus, electronic equipment, and the achievements of nuclear physics must all be used in creating new combat equipment. The appearance and utilization of electronic calculating machines opens enormous possibilities to the scientists and engineers in the field of military equipment. It is necessary to perfect the means of mechanizing engineering work and the readying of equipment for combat use, and to perfect the instruments which control the quality of combat machines and their equipment.

A strong point in Soviet science and engineering is the linking of theory and practice; this unity is necessary for technical progress in military matters. It is therefore necessary to continuously strengthen the bonds between scientists and designers and the troops in the field; scientists and designers

must visit troop units more often and provide for technical conferences on the spot. This will permit the more rapid revelation of the good and bad points of new models, and will allow for more rapid implementation of the suggestions by unit personnel for improving new equipment.

Military testing organizations perform an important role. They are called upon to test thoroughly all new models, to make evaluations of this equipment for the government, and to expose weak and strong points in the light of modern military requirements. This means that inspectors must themselves be well informed on the latest developments of science and technology, and must display inflexible exactingness and principle.

We are not fully using the capabilities of higher technical military-educational institutions for developing new equipment. Highly qualified specialists, such as the teaching staffs of academies and institutions, are not drawn strongly enough into design work. Existing design agencies have still not become the foundation for training young cadres in design work. In many cases these agencies are not given sufficient attention, and are oftentimes not staffed with the proper specialists. Important work is often given to those who do not have sufficient training to handle it.

Since no piece of military equipment is developed in isolation, but in close contact with other pieces of equipment and with all of contemporary science, designers can work successfully only if they critically assimilate and further develop all that has been created by modern science and technology. There are, however, many shortcomings in this matter: there is an insufficient number of good technical reference and handbooks on designing machines, mechanisms, and devices; little literature is being published on the achievements of domestic and foreign science and technology; and the experiments of well-known scientists and designers are poorly publicized. These tasks are entrusted to Voyenizdat (The Military Publishing House) of the Ministry of Defense USSR.

The great tasks of developing military equipment can be successfully solved only when the work of designers proceeds in the midst of courageous scientific criticism and self-criticism, and of free exchange of opinion on the problematic questions of theory and practice. Some designers strive to monopolize one entire field of specialty in order to protect themselves from criticism. This mouldy situation of reciprocal praise and ignoring mistakes, of aspiring to maintain the monopoly of certain designers, and of inevitably strangling this branch of technology, retards the growth of young cadres.

The editorial also discussed the role of party organizations in eliminating the shortcomings enumerated. (Moscow, Krasnaya Zvezda, 7 Jul 55)

It was further ordered: that all Soviet troops be withdrawn by 31 October 1955; that military district commanders make arrangements with local soviet organs to absorb these "servicemen and employees" into civilian life; and that the Commander in Chief of the Soviet Forces in Austria, commend on his own authority the best soldiers, NCOs, officers, and generals, and recommend for awards those who have distinguished themselves. Author of article, "Manage Economically, and Strictly Observe, Finance Discipline," concerning shortcomings in production enterprises of the Navy, and criticizing various unidentified plants and enterprises.

ZHUKOV identified MIRONOV as head, and NECHITAYLYUK as chief bookkeeper, of a Navy enterprise engaged in producing commodities. He stated that the plant overproduced its plan and cut waste. However, the opposite is true at the plant where Officer ALEKSEYEV is chief and VOLKOV is chief bookkeeper.

ZHUKOV criticized the Main Engineering Administration [of the Naval Forces?] for accumulating supplies above normal requirements, and the construction enterprise headed by Officer POYGIN, where no concern is shown for financial expenditures by responsible persons. ZHUKOV also stated that chast' commander PROKO-PENKO and former finance chief AFANAS'YEV do not look after stocked materials, they raise the rate of pay for repairs, and spend funds illegally. Died unexpectedly on 23 July 1955. GOLOVACHEV finished the Naval School in the city of Leningrad in 1936, and since then has held a series of posts from commander of a ship's department to commander of a soyedineniye of ships; in recent times GOLOVACHEV has been training cadres in one of the naval educational institutions.

POLEV was a member of the CPSU since 1919; he entered the Soviet Army in 1918, and participated in the Civil War and in World War II; he spent more than 20 years training officer cadres and performing scientific work at the Military Academy imeni Frunze; his decorations included the Order of Lenin, two Orders of the Red Banner, the Order of the Patriotic War First Class, the Order of the Red Star, and medals. Signed: a group of comrades. (Moscow, Krasnaya Zvezda, 20 Jul 55)

SAMOKHIN, Aleksandr Georgiyevich, Maj Gen

Died after a long, serious illness. SAMOKHIN volunteered for the Red Army in 1919, later rising from private to general; during World War II he commanded various soyedineniya, and since the end of the war has been training military cadres; his decorations included the Order of Lenin, the Order of the Red Banner, the Order of the Red Star, and medals. Signed: a group of comrades. (Moscow, Krasnaya Zvezda, 27 Jul 55)

Died unexpectedly. SHEBANIN volunteered for the Soviet Army in 1921, where he rose from officer candidate taking technical courses to lieutenant general; in 1936 he finished the Artillery Academy; during World War II he occupied responsible posts in the Leningrad, Central, and First Belorussian fronts, where he showed himself to be a good organizer and chief; since the end of the war, he has devoted himself to the further development of the Soviet Army's artillery; he was a member of the Communist Party since 1930.

SHEBANIN's decorations included the Order of Lenin, three Orders of the Red Banner, the Order of Suvorov Second Class, the Order of Kutuzov Second Class, the Order of the Patriotic War First Class, and medals. Signed: a group of comrades. (Moscow, Krasnaya Zvezda, 13 Jul 55)

VENTTSEL', Dmitriy Aleksandrovich, Maj Gen Engr-Tech Serv, Doctor of Technical Sciences, Professor, Head of a Chair at the Air Force Engineering Academy imeni

Died unexpectedly on 20 July 1955. VENTTSEL' is well known as an expert in the field of ballistics; his scientific works and textbooks enjoy wide popularity and play an important role in increasing the combat might of Soviet aviation and artillery; of his 36 years of military service, VENTTSEL' gave 27 years to training military engineers at the Artillery [Engineering] Academy imeni Dzerzhinskiy and at the Air Force Engineering Academy imeni Zhukovskiy.

His decorations included the Order of Lenin, two Orders of the Red Banner, the Order of the Patriotic War Second Class, and medals; VENTISEL' was also a Stalin Prize winner. Signed: a group of comrades. (Moscow, Krasnaya Zvezda, 22 Jul 55)
