The Bataks¹ have revived the Bintang Timur, (Star of the Orient) a daily newspaper published before the war by Parada Harahap. The N.V. Pertjetakan dan Penerbitbitan Bintang Timur (Star of the Orient Printing and Publishing Company), a limited liability company with an investment of R. 500,000, has been established to handle the paper. It will follow a policy of Indonesian nationalism. Officers are:
