1. The Scientific Inventions Society (Nauchno Izobretatelski (?) Kolektiv) was established in Varna in July 1946 by Vasil Karaguzov who was propaganda inspector in Varna. Anyone who invented a "practical object" was eligible to become a member.
2. In 1947, the name of the society was changed to Inventions and Industrial Management Union (Slyuz na Bulgarskite Izobretateli i Ratsionalizatori), and was transferred to Sofia.
3. In 1948, the union was placed under government control and became the State Institute of Inventions and Industrial Management (Duzhaven Izobretatelski i Ratsionalizatorski Institut). The office was attached to and had the same Podolania number as the Ministry of Defense. the Ministry of Defense.
