Richter, Dr.; chemist; returned to Germany in March 1952.

Rosenstein, Dr.; perhaps a physicist, returned to Germany in March 1952.

Rothenburg, Ing.; 45 years old; married, two children; worked independently in a workshop for tube filaments; returned to Germany in March 1952.

Schloehmilch, Dr.; physicist; returned to Germany in March 1952.

Schmidt, Ing.; 40 years old; married, no children; worked in a workshop for the Tool Désign and Construction Office; returned to Germany in March 1952.

Schulze, Ing. 35 years old; married, one child; worked on solidity testing of tubes with Spiegel and Mattern; returned to Germany in March 1952.

Sperling, Ing.; 40 years old; married, three children; worked on vacuum pump stands for transmitter tubes; returned to Germany in December 1950.

Spiegel (REG-149), Dipl Ing; 48 years old; arrived in Fryazino with his mother. Married a German girl while in the USSR. Radio tube specialist; returned to Germany in March 1952.

Thurley, Ing.; 48 years old; was a bachelor but married later in East Germany; worked in a laboratory for electrical measuring instruments; returned to Germany in December 1950.

Vogi (or Fogy), Dr.; Austrian; physicist; bachelor; was transferred to some other place unknown to Source. He designed electrical measuring equipment. he might have tried to get in touch with the Austrian authorities and that his sudden disappearance was due to this effort.

von Bronk, Dr.; worked with a Soviet interpreter, not a technician; field of specialization unknown; returned to Germany in December 1950.

von Brueck, Dipl Ing; 48 years old; married, two children; worked on germanium detector program; returned to Germany in March 1952.

Wiener, Ing; 40 years old; married, his wife and two children stayed in Berlin; physicist. This man, on 22 October 1948, walked around with a rope around his neck because he felt that he had been kidnapped, and this was his method of illustrating his forceful detention. The Soviets took a dim view of this, and he
