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1. The 1952 production plan of VEB Carl Zeiss, Jena, included the construction of ten electron microscopes. Only four were actually built. One of them went to Halle University, another to Prof. Alfred Recknagel, physicist at Dresden University. Two electron microscopes are still in the Zeiss works.
2. The 1953 construction plan again includes construction of ten electron microscopes, but it is doubtful whether they will be completed in the course of the year. The difficulty lies in the fact that the Zeiss technicians have not succeeded in solving the problems of high frequency technology involved, whereas they have mastered their problems of optical technology.
