A certain number of mobile derricks and drilling rods were imported from the USSR, other drilling rods from Czechoslovakia and Poland, and pipes and sleeves for drilling equipment from the USSR and Czechoslovakia. An unknown number of small and large pumps for the oil and mining industries were imported from the USSR and Czechoslovakia.
- 7. A total of 10,000 tons of magnetite, limonite, hematite, and baryta were imported from Bulgaria, as a result of orders placed in 1950. The baryta is used in sludge form to prevent the eruption of gas. The magnetite, limonite, and hematite were sent to Resita, Titan, and Nadrag; the baryta was sent to the oil industry.
- 8. An unknown quantity of coke was imported from Poland and sent to Resita. One hundred thousand tons of coke were to have been imported from Czechoslovakia by terms of a contract concluded in 1951.
- 9. Small round plates of a hard metal, quantity and metal unknown, were imported from Czechoslovakia.
- 10. An unknown number of water pipe were imported from the USSR. These pipes were of poor quality and flattened out when placed underground.
