- 1. The abortive revolt of 29 March 1953 in Salama and San Jeronimo was a premature and poorly planned attempt by a small group which was doomed to failure from the start, and the leaders of this group have fled Guatemala.
- 2. This unsuccessful attempt did not involve other stronger and better disciplined groups, totalling more than 50,000 men, and has resulted in a tightening of security measures employed by these other groups.
- The brutal and inhuman treatment accorded the rebels captured at Salama and San Jeronimo has served to increase both the overt and covert revulsion and opposition to the Arbenz regime.
