Aircraft observed at Wiener Neustadt airfield from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. on 4 April 1953 included 48 MiG-15s; nine twin-jet planes; 13 planes of undetermined type, probably low-wing monoplanes fitted with radial engines; 5 biplanes; and 4 single-engine planes. Twin-engine planes of the same type were already observed at the airfield in the fall of 1952.

25X1A [redacted] Comment. The report indicates that Wiener Neustadt airfield is still occupied by two fighter regiments. It is believed that the 13 unidentified single-engine planes were Yak-11s.
