REMARKS

1. From 4 to 5:30 p.m. on 3 April 1953 [redacted] 42 MiG-15s, 2 biplanes, 25X1  
 2 single-engine high-wing monoplanes similar to the Fieseler Storch, and  
 8 twin-engine planes at Wiener Neustadt (O 48/K 34) airfield. It appeared  
 25X1 [redacted] that the twin-jet planes were of the same type as those observed  
 at the field in the fall of 1952. [redacted] 25X1  
 25X1 [redacted] The 13 single-engine planes seen  
 on 29 March were not parked at the installation.

2. At 6:30 a.m. on 4 April, [redacted] a twin-engine transport plane  
 25X1 of an undetermined type and four Li-2s in front of the hangar at Theresien-  
 field airfield.

25X1 [redacted] Comment. Wiener Neustadt airfield is still occupied by two fighter  
 regiments. The 13 single-engine planes previously observed at the field  
 were no longer seen there. [redacted] 25X1

25X1 [redacted] The type of the twin-jet planes observed  
 in Wiener Neustadt after 4 April 1953 has not yet been determined. [redacted] 25X1
