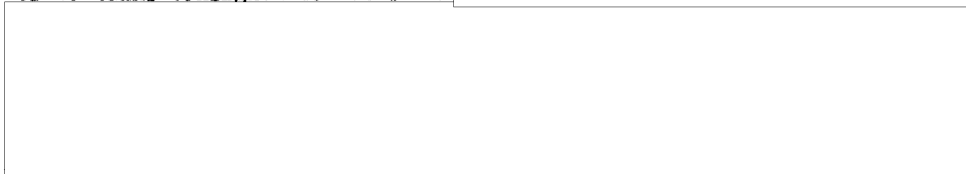

- 2. Between 15 and 25 May, eastbound traffic crossing the border included 280 empty gondola cars, 616 empty boxcars and 620 cars loaded with chemicals, commercial goods, buna, fuel and machinery. Westbound shipments included 20 tanks dispatched to Altengrabow on 16 May; 9 T-34 tanks dispatched to Kirchmoeser on 19 May; 40 light and heavy tanks to Kirchmoeser, Wuensdorf and Satz Korn on 20 May; 3 and 29 model M-13 tanks to Koenigstrueck and 8 prime movers to Altengrabow on 22 May.

- 1. Comment. This shipment is believed to be identical with the shipment of 20 tanks consigned to Wuensdorf
