In early April 1953, a sanatorium at Lungchou (N 22-22, E 106-56) and one at Taliench'eng (1129/6647/1004) near Lungchou were moved to Kuchsienchen (2654/0103/6966), Chingsi.¹ The sanatoriums, which had a total capacity of approximately 80 beds, were established for military officers of the Democratic Republic of Vietnam.
- 25X1 2. In early April 1953 three rice-grinding shops were at P'ingmengyai (N 22-57, E 105-59); four food depdts were at Lungpang (N 22-52, E 106-19) and Lungchiangch'ia (N 22-53, E 106-24); and two military supply depots were at Chiuchou (N 23-01, E 106-24).
