- 1. Between 8 a.m. and 1 p.m. on 1 June 1953, source observed that Goetzendorf (P 49/X 57) airfield and the Soviet quarters in Goetzendorf were not occupied.¹
- 2. The occupation of Parndorf (P 48/X 77) airfield and of the billet area apparently was unchanged. No air activity was observed. There was a 4/10 overcast at about 3,000 meters west-northwesterly wind of 30 to 40 km/h, gusty air, and good visibility. Truck [Redacted] was parked at the field. No change was observed on the radio installation at the field.² 25X1
- 3. Alt Kettenhof at Schwechat (P49/X 48) military post which belongs to the billet area of Zwölfaxing airfield was guarded by sentries wearing black-bordered blue epaulets. No motor vehicles or weapons were observed in the yard nor in the garages.³

- 25X1A 1. [Redacted] Comment. Goetzendorf airfield has been vacated since early 1953.
- 2. [Redacted] Comment. Parndorf airfield is occupied by a fighter regiment.
- 3. [Redacted] Comment. It appears that elements of a bomber regiment are still stationed in Zwölfaxing. [Redacted] 25X1A

25X1A [Redacted] A total of 28 Pe-2s were observed at Zwölfaxing airfield up to 16 May 1953
