Between 8 a.m. and 2 p.m. on 18 August 1953, 21 MiG-15s, 2 two-seater, single-engine monoplanes with radial engines and 1 Pe-2, which apparently had been damaged, were parked at Parndorf (P 48/X 77) airfield. One of the single-engine monoplanes took off at intervals of 20 to 30 minutes and flew wide circled over the field. A different pilot was used on each flight. The weather was fair and the visibility was good.

2. Four 37-mm AA guns were observed in the AA gun emplacement. Motor vehicles seen in front of the motor vehicle shed included trucks \_\_\_\_\_
