From 20 to 30 July 1953, DIA Feinmechanik und Ortik held a conference with representatives of VII Carl Zeiss, Jona, at which the Zeiss export plan for 1954 was to be established, rending ultimate approval by the State Flamin; Commission. The following Zeiss personnel were present:

- a. Lr. Cuenther Dorg, Disp LDR (head of the East German Sales Office), who at the same time acted as representative of Zeizs Sales Director Lorenz Fromm (SLD), who was on a vacation.
- b. Sherfried Kessler, Disr xal (head of the Sales Office for Capitalist Countries).
- c. Adolf Starke, Disp VD²(head of the Sales Office for Russia and the Catellites).

Amon, the DIA personnel present were Technical Director for Ontics Dissacker (fnu); Chief of the Flanning Department Kaiser (fnu); and Lorach (fnu), a member of the DIA Directorate.

- 2. Frior to the meeting with DIA, Zeiss, at the insistence of the Ministry for Ceneral Machine Construction, had agreed to manufacture in 1954 a total of 110 million DME worth of products. The export share of this total production was at the same time fixed at 78 million DME; products amounting to that sum were to be exported to the USSR and Soviet satellites, to non-Communist countries and to lest Cermany. Twenty million of the 76 million DME is for A-1 aerial training devices. An order for delivery of A-1 devices in 1954 has not yet been placed with Zeiss. On 24 July 1953, however, Zeiss received a teletype letter from DIA Feinmechanik and Opti indicating that the mussims would probably order for delivery in 1954 pore than 150 A-1 devices. Minister of Foreign and Domestic Trade East Crajor is now in Moscow, where he is attempting to find out exactly how many A-1 devices are to be produced and delivered in 1954.
- 3. The chief rurgose of the meeting of 28 to 30 July 1953 was to divide up the remaining 50 million DLL of 1954 Zeiss exports. DIA representatives generally tended to be rather skeptheal, since Zeiss has already incurred considerable difficulties in marketing its planned 1953 exports. DIA refused to guarantee acceptance and disposal of 58 million DLE worth of Zeiss products in 1954. A provisor agreement was reached, however, on
