1. Zain Nasution, of the World Peace Committee for Indonesia, has requested R 50,000 from the Chung Hua Chia Tuan Tsung Hui (CHCTTH) to hold a convention in November 1953. In West Java, the Bogor, Sukabumi, Tjiandjur, and Bandung branches of the World Peace Committee are no longer financially solvent. Of the 7,650 members in 1952, only 2,500 are still active in 1953.¹
2. Since January 1953, the Gerakan Wanita Indonesia Serban (GERWIS) has failed to contribute its monthly sum of R 2,500 to the treasury of the Sentral Organisasi Buruh Seluruh Indonesia, and has also requested aid from the CHCTTH.

1. [REDACTED] Comment. The Indonesian radio has stated (4 September 1953) that the National Peace Congress would convene in Djakarta on 31 October, according to an announcement of the Congress Preparation Committee. The membership figure of the World Peace Committee in Indonesia, reported from Moscow in [REDACTED] was 10,000 (date of information early 1953).
