2. [redacted] Comment. The volume of foodstuff handled [redacted] remained constant. The traffic relations also remained unchanged. The foodstuff went to large GDRG and army ration supply depots.

3. [redacted] Comment. Deliveries from the mill center in Wurzen again increased about 50 percent as compared with preceding months. They thus had the same volume during the period under review as they had during the average month in 1952. The decrease during the first five months in 1953 probably resulted from the food crisis which prevailed in East Germany at that time.
