In the past, allottee 88000 has actually been used for the allotments of the following services: the Ministry of the Interior, the State Secretariat for the Administration of the State Reserve, and the Soviet units in East Germany. After June 1953, the allotment plan was changed. The final version which was worked out by Referat for Methods of Commodity Circulation (Methodik der Farenbewegung) of the State Committee for Material Procurement been published.
