- 1. A Polish artillery unit is located in the former German barracks situated on ul. Kosciuszki (Yorckstrasse), Elk (Lyck). After the war these barracks were repaired, but no new construction is to be seen.
- 2. For exercises: the unit uses the large, approximately 10 kilometer-long artillery grounds, situated south of Orzysz (Arys) between Gross Schweykowen (BSE/A65), Wolfsheide (R54/A65) and Wiersbinnen (R54/A66).
- 3. Other barracks located on the same side of ul. Kosciuszki, close to the artillery barracks, are occupied by a Polish infantry unit. Here too, just repairs were made after the war and no new buildings have been erected.
