

- Until recently the town of Skierniewice (\$52/P 45) had no power station of its own and obtained electric current from Logz. At the beginning of 1954 a power plant was put into commission in Skierniewice, and this now supplies electric current to the town.
- The power station has one building, approximately 17 meters long, 7-8 meters wide and approximately 10-12 meters high. Two transformer stations have been erected near the building; from these, cables lead to HT pylons standing along the Skierniewice - Warsaw highway (see sketch for location of power station, marked E).
