[Redacted] bureau in charge of explosives for the entire Waldenburg mining district. This bureau was informed on the monthly coal output of all mines because it had to calculate the ratio existing between coal output and the quantity of explosives consumed. In 1953, a monthly average of 230,000 tons of hard coal was produced in the five mines of the Waldenburg coal district (O 51/H 07). Of this quantity, about 45,000 tons were accounted for by the "Chrobry" mine, 50,000 tons by the "Victoria" mine, 60,000 tons by the "Thorez" mine, 40,000 tons by the "Mieszko" mine, and 35,000 tons by a mine in Neurode. In 1953, the "Victoria" mine was scheduled to produce 60,000 tons of coal per month. The Poles made every effort to increase coal production in the Waldenburg area. For instance, the production target for the "Victoria" mine in 1955 was fixed at 1 million tons of hard coal. Source definitely believed that this target would not be reached.
