1. On 11 June 1954, a train with 50 AT guns came from the direction of Cottbus and passed through the Frankfurt/Oder railroad station toward an undetermined destination. 25X1

2. On 19 June, a train of 34 flatcars with 68 artillery pieces arrived at Eisenwalde. The shipment came from Brest Litovsk. [redacted]

3. On 21 June, a train with 12 x 122-mm field howitzers and 3 rocket launchers [redacted] which came from Eisenwalde [redacted] unloaded at Satskova. 25X1

4. On 24 June, 52 x 57-mm AT guns were loaded onto a train at the Eisenthal railroad station. An additional 57-mm AT gun was hauled to the railroad station. 25X1

5. [redacted] Comment. The artillery pieces probably were 122-mm field howitzers consigned to the GDR ordnance depot at Eisenwalde. On 13 June 1954, another train with 94 x 122-mm field howitzers was observed proceeding toward [redacted] 25X1

6. [redacted] Comment. Elements of the train mentioned in paragraph 2 probably were [redacted] reassembled to the 20th Gds S&L Div. [redacted] 25X1

7. [redacted] Comment. The AT guns probably were to be shipped back to the USSR. 25X1
