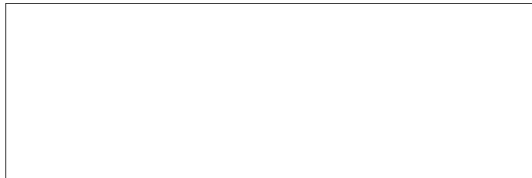

1. On 20 June 1954, a summer festival was in progress in the village of Samonino (9 km. south of Kartuzy), which was attended by several scores of uninvited Soviet soldiers who arrived in two trucks.
2. The entertainment was stopped upon their arrival, because all women present departed. The only people left on the spot were the organizing committee and several young men who took up a fairly hostile attitude towards the gate rashers.
3. After a short stay the Soviet men left in the direction of Koscierzyzna. According to one of them, their unit is quartered in the Puszcza Tucholska (Forest of Tuchola--P54/N70).
