During the morning on 12 June 1954, 4 officers and 15 EM wearing an undetermined service color were engaged in surveying in a meadow which formerly belonged to the southwestern section of Hagenow airfield. This is an old German field, which now is under cultivation. The soldiers used 5 large side-screw bow-points and 2 theodolites on tripods. Work was obviously being done with a specific purpose in mind. Previously several artillery survey sections had been observed at the field. About noon on the same day, surveying was underway in the southeastern section of the field. Two Soviet Air Force officers were also present at the field and followed the work with interest but did not actually participate in it themselves.
2. On 15 June, the 2 air force officers and 5 army officers appeared at the field and inspected the former field area, part of which had been used as training grounds and was covered with fire trenches, one-man holes and dugouts. At these spots the team stopped and talked about the matter. Up to 15 July, no observations could be made bearing any connection with the surveying mentioned.

Comment. The former German airfield near Hagenow is located about 30 km southwest of Schwerin and 4 km east of Hagenow. The field is not serviceable. It has been used as training grounds by infantry troops. The purpose of surveying has not been determined. It appears doubtful whether it is connected with an intended reconstruction of the field.
