1. [Redacted] Comment. Porechik airfield is still occupied by a fighter regiment. Aircraft [Redacted] was previously observed in Wittstock. The presence at Porechik airfield of twin-jet aircraft is unusual. Although the description indicates that the aircraft were Il-28s, efforts have been initiated to definitely determine details of the aircraft. It is possible that the presence of these aircraft is connected with a report from Puetnitz according to which two new aircraft types conducted air activity between 20 June and 9 July 1954. During this period, German personnel were allegedly restricted from Puetnitz airfield.
