REMARKS			

1. Between 1430 and 1450 on 27 July 1954, no aircraft, personnel or activity were observed at Zwoelfaring (48°07' N/ 16°27' E) airfield. The Token-type radar set made 3 rotations in a clockwise direction per minute. Around 1448 the set stopped rotating. While the set was in operation or stopped, no personnel were seen nearby. No van-like truck could be identified in the vicinity of the set. Six men wearing black-bordered blue epaulets left the barracks building at the airfield and proceeded toward Schwechat (48°08' N/16°28' E).
2. Between 1500 and 1520 on 27 July, the Altkettenhof in Schwechat military post was guarded by sentries wearing black-bordered blue epaulets. Six motor vehicles were parked in the garages. The umbrella-type antenna seemed to have a thin mast.

Comment. The radar station with a Token-type set at Zwoelfaring airfield is known. Since only air force personnel has previously been observed nearby it is assumed that the installation is subordinate to the Soviet Air Force, possibly to the fighter division at Wiener Neustadt airfield.
