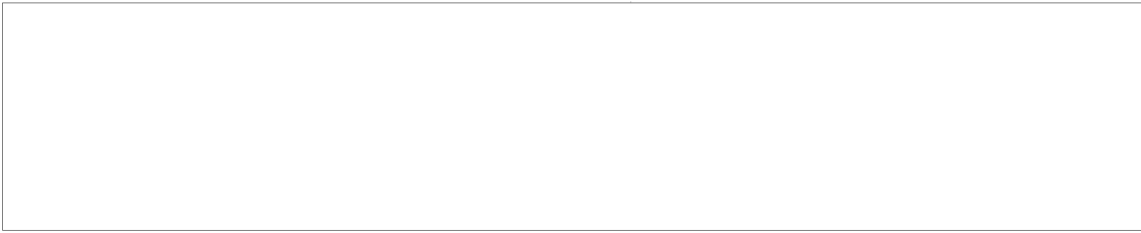

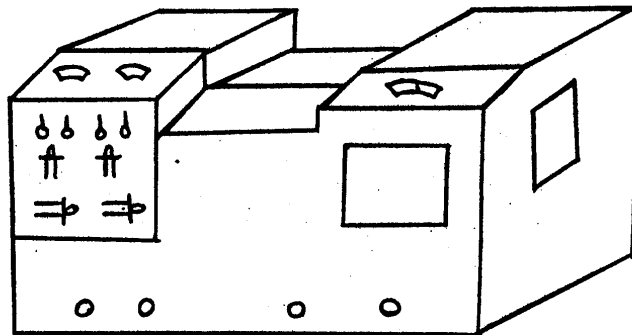

1. The electrical laboratory of Zavod 393, in Krasnogorsk, was requested to review an automatic all-electric computer for antiaircraft fire direction. There was no manufacturer's name plate attached to the instrument. Dipl. Ing. Ehrhardt, who rectified some trifling difficulty with the instrument
2. The instrument was approximately 100 x 80 x 60 cm. and looked approximately like the sketch below.

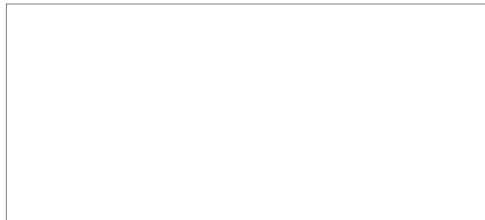

It was painted gray. The front portion was unsymmetrical in layout. No CRT was visible. The instrument looked new. It had three or four electrical outlets along the bottom. There were no electrical outlets in the recess on top of the instrument.
