	a. On the theory of the final Hilbert transformation (sic) (Zur Theorie der endlichen Hilberttransformation) and

5.	During 1954, the Institute of Tensile Strength Studies has been engaged on a research task, that of the development and construction of an experimental tank (Wasserkanal) for current flow investigations.
