1. [redacted] two fully armed Chinese Communist naval craft of less than 1,000 tons were observed at Taku Bar, sailing in the direction of Shanghai, (sketch A). 25X1
2. A 6 - 7,000 ton merchant vessel was docked at Taku Bar. The ship's side was painted in white with a strip of green through the middle. 25X1
3. [redacted] in the vicinity of T'ungsha (6894/3097), three Chinese Communist naval vessels and two landing craft were observed sailing in a southerly direction. One of the naval vessels was approximately 2,000 tons and the other two were about 1,000 tons each. (sketch A). The landing craft were estimated to be a little over 1,000 tons each. (sketch B). 25X1
4. [redacted] two small Chinese Communist naval vessels and one troop ship were anchored off Woosung (sketch C), and three to five jet aircraft were flying overhead. 25X1
5. [redacted] the CHANG CHIANG (7022/3068), two landing craft, one troop ship, and five patrol craft were anchored at the Naval pier number 1, Shanghai. There were approximately five hundred Chinese Communist sailors undergoing drill practice on the pier. 25X1
6. [redacted] five or six large and small Chinese Communist naval vessels were observed sailing south in the vicinity of T'ungsha. Small gunboats were patrolling constantly between Shanghai and T'ungsha on 25 September. 25X1
7. [redacted] armed Chinese Communist soldiers and sailors were observed on the streets of Shanghai. The soldiers were dressed in light grey uniforms and the sailors were dressed in white uniforms with green trimming. 25X1

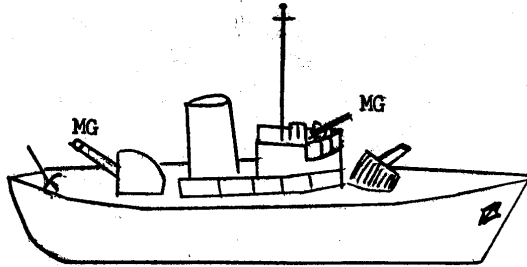

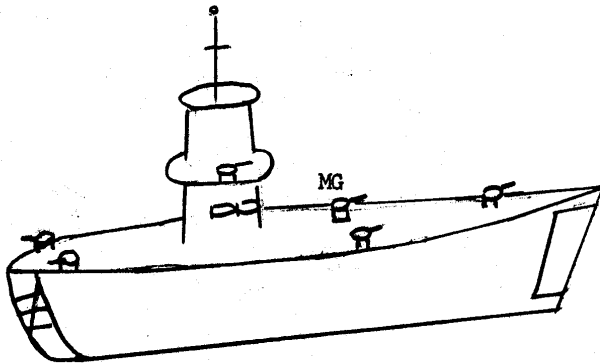

- 8. Cloth rationing was recently established in Shanghai. Each person is allotted forty feet per year. Rice rationing has not been started.

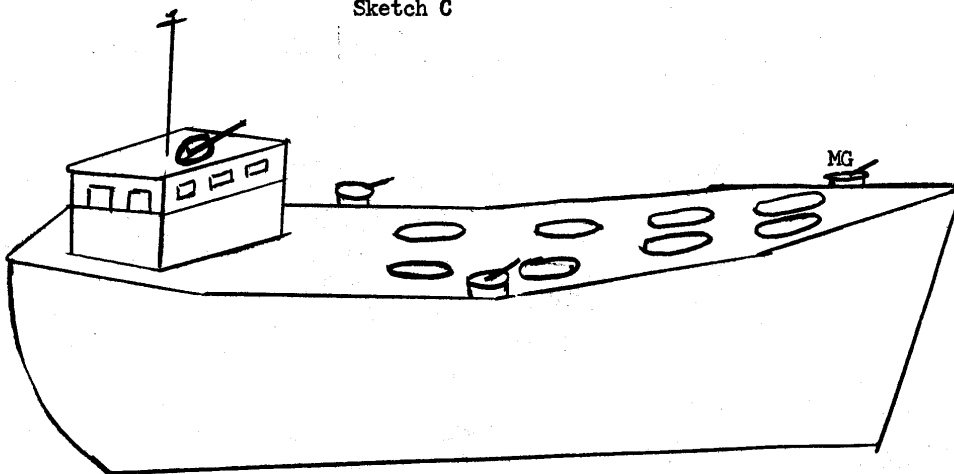
