

- 7. The Vane-Balti Shipyard has a floating dock which came from Gdynia. The type of production at these yards is not known. Several thousand workers are employed there.
- 8. As a rule, very few soldiers are to be seen in Tallinn, whereas naval personnel are very much in evidence.
- 9. Students of navigation schools, when they are called into service, are taken into the Navy and trained to become midshipmen. It is not known whether any Soviet naval officers serve on Soviet merchant ships for practical training.
- it has become permissible quite recently for civilians to wish Tallinn harbor, provided they have a valid reason, such as a relative working there. To gain admittance, the visitor must show his passport and obtain an entrance ticket, which is valid for one visit. Otherwise, the harbor is a prohibited area.
