Analysis of the State Budget Plan for 1955

A. Total Budget

1. The State Budget Plan for 1955 was formulated in accordance with the tasks set down in the Economic Plan. That part of the national income incorporated in the State Budget will be utilized to implement the Economic Plan.

The balance for the 1955 State Budget Plan shows a surplus of 28.8 million DME. To regether with the surplus from 1954, the total budget surplus will amount to 1,137.5 million DME.

During 1954, the Besirke accounted for 20.4% of the riccipte of expenditures of the budget. In 1955, the Besirke share will be 24.2%. In this respect, the Besirke budget volume is to rise by 1,638.3 million DME or 22.6% over 1954.

2. The State Budget volume is to increase 3.4% in 1955 over that of 1954, although the national income is expected to rise 8% concurrently. The fact that the volume is not expanding as rapidly as the income is due to the effect of the price decreases in 1954 (which, as every year, bring a relative decline in volume as opposed to national income growth.) For particularly, however, it is due to the introduction of the system whereby nationalized enterprises use their profits to finance current assets increments (Umlaufmittelsufuehrungen) and investments. A comparison with 1954 on the basis of the financing methods which existed in 1954 would show an increase of 4.7% in the State Budget volume. The smaller growth of budget volume, as compared to national income, shows a that the 1955 State Budget included a relatively smaller share of the national income than in 1954, while the portion

retained by the population directly is relatively increased. This implies a further increase in the living standard of the population.

B. Mationalised Economy

Income from the nationalised economy ...is an ever breadening segment of the total income of the State Budget Plan. In 1955, it is to increase by 11.15 over 1954 and amount to 36.35 of the total budget income. However, it should be noted that increased ingone from the nationalized economy results wtially from the expanded introduction of the production tax (Produktionsabgabe), i.e. from a changed method of calculating income. On the other hand, there is a decline in income from the nationalised economy due to use of net profits (Nettegeminne) of nationalised enterprises for financing curvent assets requirements and investments. In terms comparable with 1954, the income from nationalized economy increase by 14.9% in 1955 over 1954.

Expenditures in 1955 are to decline about 36.45 over 1954. This is due to reductions in plant costs (Selbstkostensenkung) in enterprises which require state subsidies to promote their production, and to the price changes for Schwarzmetalle which led to a decrease of dest 250 million IME in subsidies for metallurgical enterprises.

1. Industry (Contrally Directed)

The planning of budget receipts and expenditures in the nationalised industry sphere was based on a goods production of 31,887.9 million DES at factory sales prices (Nerene bigabepreist). Plant cost reductions amounted to 4.6% for the centrally directed industry as a whole. This results in an Akkasulation figure of 8,467.6 million DME, 14.0% more than in 1954. This increase stems from a rise in goods production and wider introduction of the production tex, as well as from 1,358.9 million DME reductions in plant costs, among other reasons. Wil.2 million DE of the mes profits of nationalised enterprisegues to be utilised for financing ourrent asset , requirements, and investments. As a result there is a budget Akkumulation of 8,0264 million DE from the centrally directed nationalised industry. As a fine respect to 100% about the Akkumulation tasks set down in the Economic Plan and in the State Budget Plan can only be performed if the measures demanded by the 20th and 21st Plens of the SED Central Committee are consistently carried out in the State apparatus and in the economic direction.

The State Budget Plan for 1955 anticipates a payment of 996.8 million DME (cleared) into the Treasury from all trade enterprises, The esonemic development is planned as follows in the individual trade segments:

a) Wholesale Trade

The introver in wholesale trade during 1955 will increase to 101. of the 1954 turnover. The 1955 plan anticipates a cost of 5.50 has jub 100 Des wholesale trade turnever, identical with the actual 1954 cost. However, the 1955 plan is still far behind the stingletiers of the 1954 plan which anticipated a cost of 5.20 DE per 100 DE wholesale trade turnsver. The planed cost per 100 DE turnsver in 1995 is partially due to the fact that wholesale trade has taken over new functions, for example direct delivery to the sales of the fact that wholesale trade has taken over and transport and passing costs, which, in 1955 are This is the cost of wholesale trade. A budget Akkumulation of 499.1 million DME is anticipated in wholesale trade in 1955.

b) Retail Trade

The turnever in state retail trade, calculated in current prices, is to increase in 1955-by 104-761 with 1954. Circulation costs (Zirkulationskosten) in retail trade are to decline by 6.0% as compared to 1954. A part of the cost reduction is due to the transfer of former wholesale trade functions from state retail trade to the wholesale trade efficies. A budget Akhamulation of 504-1 million DES is enticipated in state retail trade.

3. Traffic

The contribution of the Deutsche Resolutions in 1955 is to be 1085 of that of 1954. The operating costs are to decime by 3.8%. The average income per passenger kilometer is to increase to 4.36 prennig as opposed to 4.17 prennig in 1954. These three facts lead to an increase of 182.9 million DNE in Deutsche Reichsbahn payments into the State Treasury over 1954.

4. Post and Telecosmunications

The Deutsche Post's contributions in 1955 is to be 104.9% of that in 1954. Reductions in operating costs are set at 0.7%. As a result, the budget Akkumulation will increase by 15.9 million DME. The decrease in postal rates on 1 October 1954 leads to a decline of 26.3 million DME in income in 1955. As a result, Deutsche Post payments into the State Treasury will be reduced by 10.4 million DME, making the 1955 payments 192.1 million DME. 26.9 million DME of the net profit are to be utilized for the financing of investments.

C. Agriculture (Nationalized, Cooperative and Private)

1. Nationali de de de la lare

a) Nationalized Farms (VEGs)

Production by nationalized farms is to increase 78.8% over 1954 actual yield. The Economic Plan antipipates a reduction in operating costs of 35.16 because of the new prices, resulting in a reduction in subsidies (cleared) of 193.2 million DME over 1954. Because of the introduction of new prices for agricultural products from nationalized farms, the loss subsidies will decline a further 157.3 million DME (these subsidies new appear in Aufgabenbereich 5 as adjustment for the nationalized farms). The total supports for mationalized farms amount to 85.3 million DME in the 1955 plan.

b) State Forestry Enterprises

11.5 million DME more in subsidies (cleared) are planned for state forestry enterprises in 1955 than in 1954. The subsidy increase in based one the increase in output through road-building and forest protection and the reduction in profits as a result of less wood cutting.

c) Machine Tractor Stations (MTS)

Expenditures of 770.9 million IME are planned for the machine tractor stations in 1955 - 12.9% more than in 1954. The increase of MTS expenditures results from a 32.4% increase in performance and a reduction of 17.7% in operating costs (that is, 158.7 million IME).

d) Nationalized Purchasing Enterprises (VEAB)

2,959.9 million DME have been made available for price supports in 1955 for the buying up (Aufkauf) of agricultural products under terms of the Economic Plan.

e) Other Measures for Furthering Agriculture

577.8 million DME have been set saids for the remaining measures to further agriculture in 1955. The increase in expenditures results from the expenditure of 93.3 million DME promoting the conversion of local agricultural enterprises into presention cooperatives. It is also due to increased expenditures for general veterinary matters, for zoological-technical advisory service, for past control and water problems.

17.7 million DME are planned in the State Budget for immediate promotion of the agricultural production cooperatives (veterinarity darks, auton, schooling, etc.). In addition, 10.5 million DME are set saide for purchasing the first dairy cow for former farm workers who enter production cooperatives.

The 1955 plan does not include the following expenditures made in 1954 which resulted from provisional y decrees of the Council of Ministers:

- a) Cost of crop stake (Ernteeinsatz)
- b) Crop salvaging costs (Erntebergungskosten)
- c) Payment of workers' wages and antisans to bills counts for agricultural enterprises during the state administration.

(In 1954, 22.6 million DMB from the State Budget were available for these purposes.)

In 1955, 308.9 million DME are available for agricultural production cooperatives under the long-term credit plan, 15.0 million are available for BHO, and 116.5 million DME for dairy cooperatives and private agriculture; Thus, the production cooperatives have 80.0 million DME more available in 1955 than in 1954 and private agriculture 70.8 million DME more. 26.0 million DME are anticipated in the long-term credit plan for daive stock and (Viehbesetz) in the former local agricultural enterprises.

D. <u>Investments</u>

The State Budget Plan for 1955 anticipetes 2.933.6 million DME for financing of investments and 220 million DME for project drafting (Project learny). This is 1914.7 million DME less than in 1954. The decrease of budget expenditures for investments results from the financing of planned housing construction by DIB (Deutsche Investitionbank) bonds and the introduction of net profit utilization for investment financing. 470.6 million DME in net profits are being used directly by enterprises of the nationalized economy for investment financing. Taking these amounts into account, there is an increase of 675.9 million DME in state expenditures for investments over 1954.

E. Taxes

The State Budget income from taxes in 1955 amounts to 38.7% of the total judget income, as compared to 42.9% in 1954. Taxes on wages amount to 3.4% of the total budget income in 1955.

F. State Budget Expenditures for Culturel, Social and Health Purposes

An increase of budget funds of about 2.5% - 10,857.3 million DME (without investments) as opposed to 10,585.9 million DME (without investments) in 1954 - is anticipated in the cultural, social and public health fields in 1955. With this, the total set in the Five-Year Plan for this area is fulfilled by 111.9%.

- Expenditures for education, science and culture increase by 211.6 million DME or 7.5% to a total of 3,030.8 million DME. Included in this is an increase of 1.3% for general technical. Among these schools, the funds for high schools (Oberschulen)/fibreased by 3.3%, particularly for financing an increase in the number of high school students by 3.855. Special schools and instruction courses receive an increase of 20% for training (Qualifizierung) cadres in technical schools. (Pachschulwesen). In this connection particular attention is paid to training agricultural cadres. An increase in the number of technical day I students (Tagesfachschuler) by 5,423 is also taken into account here. Compared to 1954, university and colleges. I expenditures are increased in 1955 there will be 55 million DME (or 13.5%) more to increase the average number of fail-time university students by 16.6% or 10,190 students. Expenditures for natural scientific-technical research increase by 12.1%. Contributions to the theater are reduced from 112.5 million to 107.4 million DME.
- 2. Expenditures for labor and social matters in 1955 will amount to 4,780.0 million DME. The funds for workmen's are protection increase by 29.6%, those for vacation, nursing and welfare homes by 10.9% with an

increase of capacity by 3,633 spenings. On the other hand, funds for social welfare will decline by about 20 million DME or 10.2% and funds for household relief by 10.3% because of a reduction in the number of recipients of relief and personal social insurance pension payments will increase by 1.8% or 53.7 million DME. In 1.51, 678.0 million DME were paid out for sickness benefits, household and print money while in 1955, only 611.6 million DME are available. In these connection, it is anticipated that the average sickness rate in the 14 Besirke will decrease from 5.16% in 1951 to 10.60% in 1955, and in Berlin from 6.12% to 5.85%. A rise of 3.6% or 216.1 million DME is anticipated in the income from obligatory social insurance contributions as a result of the expected increase in the gross wage figure. A contribution of 1,056.0 million DME through the social insurance as compensation for public health affairs is anticipated in 1955.

3. Expenditures for public health matters will be increased from $3_p367.8$ to $3_p491.1$ million IME = 3.1% Included in the increase is an addition of 4_p675 beds in permanent installations, 10 polyelinics and 28 rural dispensaries (Landambulatorien). Expenditures for installations for mother and child protection increase by 16.5 million IME or 24.75 with a growth in the number of places in nurseries and permanent homes for infants and small children by 11_p255 .

G. Budget Expenditures for Communal Installations and for Highways

An increase of 192.2 million DNE is anticipated for communal installations. 9.4 million DNE more has been set aside in 1955 for highways than was paid out in 1954. Expenditures for drafting offices (Entwurfsbueres) increase from 116.0 to 136.5 million DNE, while the income from these drafting offices increases from 128.0 to 143.9 million DNE in 1955.

M. Administrative Costs

The State Budget anticipates no increase in national administrative costs ever the amount registered in 1954. Administrative costs for the local organs will Fise by only 0.3% compared to actual expenditures in 1954. In 1955, administrative costs amount to 7.6% of the total expenditures of the State Budget as compared to 7.8% in 1954.
