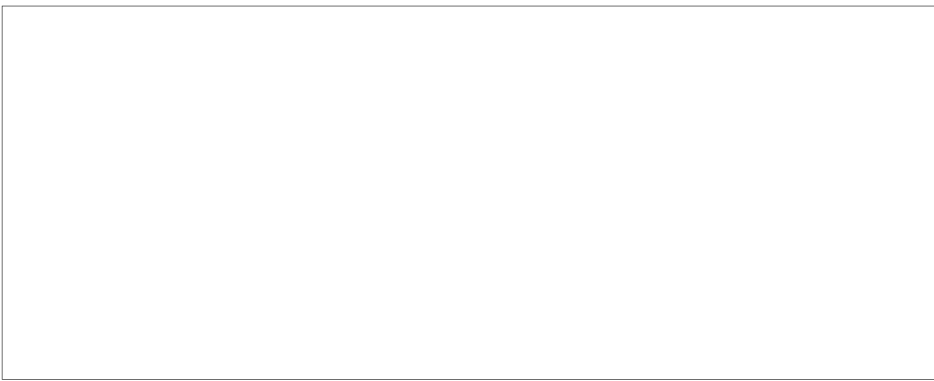

1. Between 0930 and 1130 on 17 August 1955, 50 MiG-15s and 1 Li-2 were counted at Deutsch Wagram airfield.

2. On 17 August billeting equipment, civilian equipment, containers, and lumber were loaded at Deutsch Wagram railroad station. The following equipment was loaded for shipping:

- 1 truck with searchlight [REDACTED] 25X1
- 4 trucks [REDACTED] the load of which was covered with tarpaulins; 25X1
- 5 tank trucks;
- 1 aggregate;
- 3 Stalin-type prime movers [REDACTED] 25X1
- 12 containers, 4 of which had a diameter of about 3 meters, 8 with diameters of about 2 meters. All containers were approximately as long as normal gondola cars.

[REDACTED] motor vehicles were employed in the transfer of equipment from Deutsch Wagram military post to the railroad station:
