This hydroelectric station furnished electricity for the administrative and governmental buildings and for most of the homes and streets. Gorodishche had no water or sewerage system.

- 8. The rayon newspaper was Sovetskaya rodina, a weekly publication printed in Russian; its contents were almost entirely a reprint of the Baranovichi Krasnaya zvezda. A subscription to Sovetskaya rodina cost 90 kopeks per month.
- 9. The divisions of Rayispolkom included Zags, a General Complaint Department for final appeals to the Rayispolkom, a technical section, a Rayon General Welfare Office, a Division of Social Welfare, a Division of Kolkhozy, and a Central Statistical Directorate.
