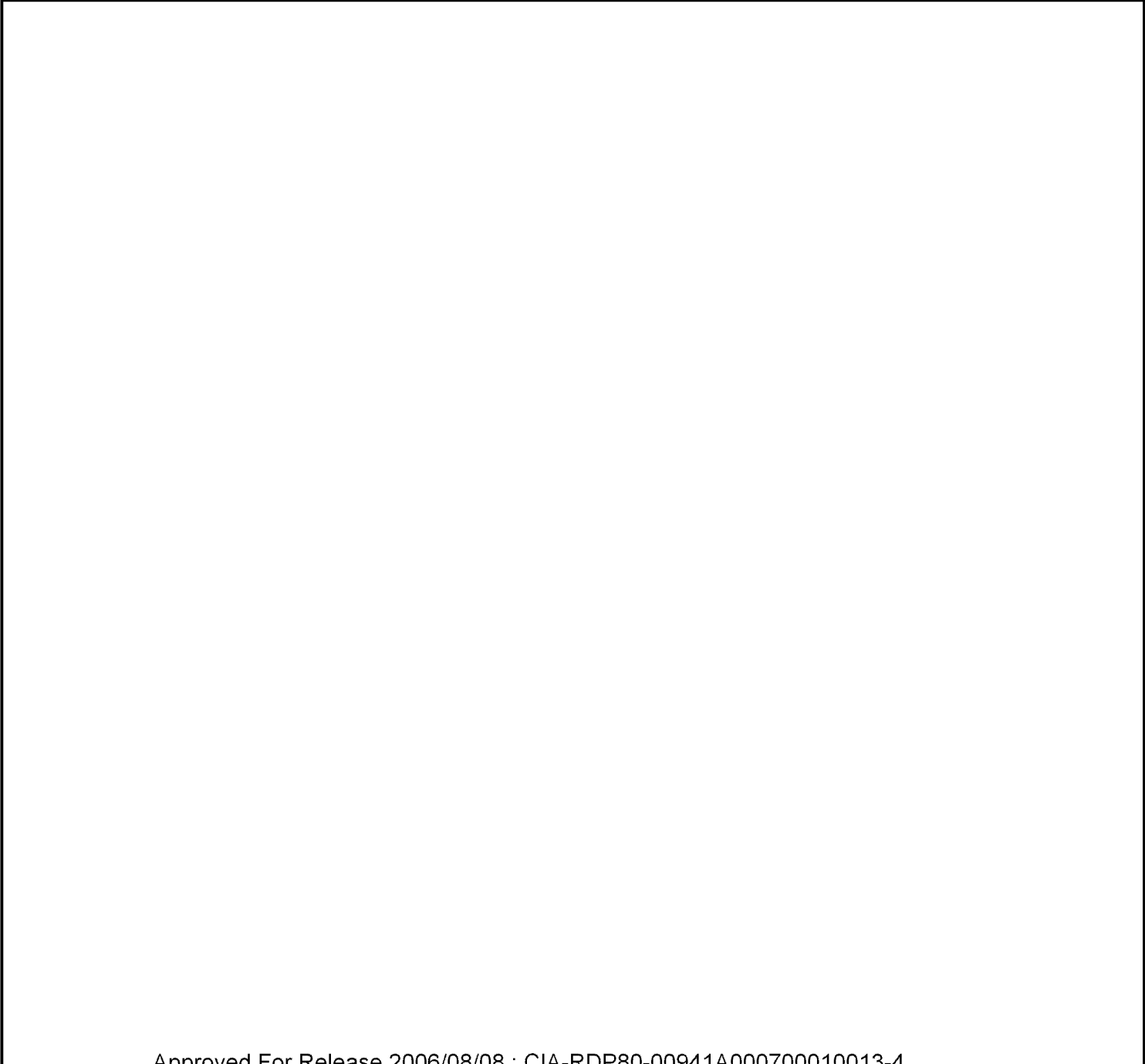

25X1 13. [REDACTED] THIRD AGENCY Called Ron Heller, Office of Legislative Affairs, FBI, to discuss procedures for implementing the understanding on the third agency rule reached at the 3 August Senate-House conference on the State Department authorization bill. I confirmed with Heller that the agreement on procedures that had been reached between the Department of State and the Agency earlier in the day was the same as the one previously worked out between State and the Bureau. Heller and I agreed that the same procedures would be used for FBI-CIA dealings on requests for documents by the Senate Foreign Relations Subcommittee on International Operations.

25X1 14. [REDACTED] THIRD AGENCY Called Nelson Ledsy, Office of Legislative Affairs, Department of State. I asked Ledsy whether he knew who at the Department was going to attend the meeting scheduled for Thursday, 17 August, in House Judiciary Subcommittee on Immigration, Citizenship and International Law Chairman Joshua Eilberg's (D., Pa.) office on access to documents on alleged Nazi war criminals. Ledsy later called back to tell me that he had found out that Assistant Secretary of State for Consular Affairs Barbara Watson would be attending the meeting.

25X1 15. [REDACTED] IEFING Accompanied Pat Taylor, NFAC/CSS, to the periodic briefing of House Minority Leader John Rhodes (R., Ariz.). Mr. Rhodes explained to me that AT&T representatives had told him they do not want and do not need the electronic surveillance bill. This was after I had indicated my contrary understanding of testimony I had heard from the AT&T General Counsel. (See Memorandum for the Record by Pat Taylor.)

[REDACTED] LIAISON Met with Keith Raffel, Senate Select Committee on Intelligence staff, who said the Committee had nearly completed its report entitled "National Security Secrets: Their Proper Place in the Law." They would like our review of the report for security considerations prior to release. 25X1

24. [REDACTED] EMPLOYMENT REQUEST Received a call from David Self, in the office of Senator S. I. Hayakawa (R., Calif.), requesting a professional employment application for a constituent. I told him we would send him one. OLC Registry was advised. 25X1

[REDACTED] LIAISON Received a call from Tom Smeeton, House International Relations Committee staff, asking if the Agency had an unclassified chart showing relative strength of Warsaw Pact nations. After checking with CSS/NFAC, I called Mr. Smeeton and told him we had nothing unclassified on that subject. He thanked me for my help. 25X1
