On 6 December 1951 the Director of the Psychological Strategy Board referred appropriate portions of PSB [Redacted] "Break-Off of Korean Armistice Negotiations", and [Redacted] "Psychological Operations Plan Incident to Korean Cease-Fire Negotiations" to the Central Intelligence Agency, with the request that the 10/2 consultants assume responsibility for the coordination of the covert implementation of these Plans. 25X1

It is my understanding that your committee has met from time to time during the past several months for the purpose of accomplishing this task. I have been further informed, however, that to date no agreement has been reached by the Central Intelligence Agency and the Department of Defense with regard to your respective responsibilities in implementing the plans nor has an operational plan been agreed upon to discharge your responsibilities.

I shall appreciate having your advice as to the present status of your efforts to achieve agreement on these issues. If you feel that some further action by the Psychological Strategy Board or by this staff could assist in coordinating the implementation of these Plans I would be grateful for your suggestions.
