MEMORANDUM TO THE FILE

Central Intelligence Agency Audit

In a telephone conversation with the Deputy Director (Support), CIA, on Monday, May 15, 1961, the Deputy Director advised that it would be permissible to maintain a copy of the Comptroller General's letters dated May 16, 1961, to the Honorable Paul J. Kilday, and to the Director of Central Intelligence in a locked safe file in the main General Accounting Office Building. He advised further that no special security measures would be required because CIA is involved, but that the specific letters should be maintained in safe file cabinets acceptable for storage of other classified documents, with access thereto restricted to individuals cleared for CIA purposes.

This clearance applies to the specific letters mentioned above. Any other materials classified by CIA for security purposes would have to be specifically cleared before they can be maintained at other than the safe files located at the audit site.
