Cookridge, who has been working on his study for theer years, challenges Gehlen on Bormann head-on.

Geheral Gehlen is guilty of raving misled a ther the public in 1971, or the CIA and several German Federal Government offices in 1953 and 1965. He are that in 1966 he began investigations that Bormann's late, and in the 1950s received reliable information that Rormann was alive and in the Soviet Union.

Yet he never disclosed this to anybody for 25 years. In fact, on at least two occasions, he officially informed the CIA and others of his superiors that, according to his investigations, Martin Bormann died in the crossifier during the fighting in Berlin on May 2, 1945."
