

The Civil Service Commission will conduct a series of Institutes in Public Problems and Federal Programs to provide federal executives with an appreciation of major problems affecting the national interest and to make available to these officials for the discharge of their executive responsibilities a background of current information drawn both from within the government and from other highly qualified sources.

CONTENT

The institutes will focus upon:

- Selected contemporary issues, trends and problems.
- Approaches to the development of policy, plans and programs.
- Government-wide effects of programs of agencies involved in contemporary public issues and the impact of these programs upon others.

Emphasis in each institute will be upon coherent organization and understanding of a group of related topics.

The first Institute will take place in April 1962 and, against a background examination of American life and the economic issues of the next two decades, the program will survey:

- . America's Needs for Natural Resources
 - Public Planning for the Management of Natural Resources
 - . New Patterns of Liban Needs and Development
 - Intergovernmental Coardination in Meeting Public Needs

ELIGIBILITY

Participation in this Institute will be open to experienced career executives who are at the GS-15 level and above who have responsibility for major programs of their agencies.

HOW TO APPLY

Nominations should be submitted to the Director, Management Institutes, Office of Career Development through the agency's training representative. Civil Service Commission registration cards should be completed for each nominee. Nominations must be received by close of business March 9, 1962 and are subject to confirmation by the Civil Service Commission. Confirmation will be made to Personnel or Employee Development Officers by March 16, 1962.

COSTS

The expenses of the institute, estimated at \$125 per participant, will be prorated among participating agencies. All confirmed registrations will be subject to the pro-rate charge. Each appointment must specify the office to which the bill should be directed. This training, in its entirety, will be conducted through Government facilities.
