MEMORANDIM FOR: Deputy Director of Central Intelligence

SUBJECT: Senior Officers Orientation Course Conducted by the U. S. Army Special Warfare School

- 1. The course at Fort Bragg was attended by 96 officers and civilians. The great majority of the class were regular A:my officers in the grade of Colonel. There were three General officers present, and a small number of Lieutenant Colonels and Majors were also included. The eleven civilians ranged from GS-12 to FSO-1.
- 2. The course included we days of instruction and constituted a survey of the principles of counter-insurgency operations, review of a number of case studies, and some briefing on the capabilities and role of the U.S. Army Special Forces.
- 3. The instruction was of high quality and the course did an excellent job of acquainting senior officers, who had no previous experience in the field, with the problems of counter-insurgency. I strongly recommend that we continue to use the two billets available to the Agency, but I would suggest that, instead of sending professional paramilitary people, we would benefit more by sending senior Agency officials whose work is affected by the problem of counter-insurgency but who have not had the opportunity to be exposed to all the military technicalities.
