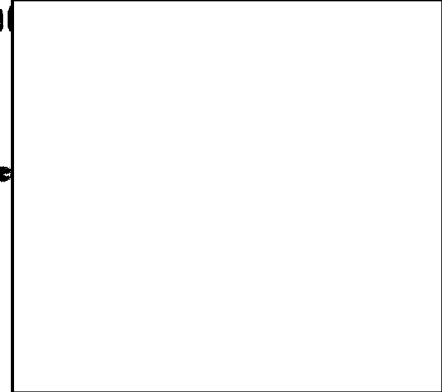

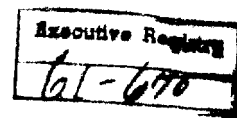

Dear Mr. Dulles:

Thank you for assigning [redacted] to help in my mission to Vietnam, 2-14 January 1961. His assistance made a vital contribution to what was accomplished and it was my pleasure to so inform the Secretary and Deputy Secretary of Defense in my private report to them. I know that they join me in warm appreciation of your thoughtful help.

[redacted] was far more than a French linguist and interpreter in this work in Vietnam. He was welcomed as an old friend and companion by leading Vietnamese such as the President, Vice President, and Cabinet members, as well as by political oppositionists and people in many walks of life with whom we worked. His cheerful willingness to work long hours when necessary and his kindly patience with Asians under trying circumstances gave added meaning to his contribution. It should also be noted that he was unhesitatingly responsive to whatever needed doing when in areas of physical danger, such as in the Communist Viet Cong zone at the southern tip of Camau where Free Vietnamese settlers are wresting territory away from Communists who have held it by force since 1945.
