**MEMORANDUM FOR GENERAL CABELL, CIA**

**Subject: Secure Telephone for the Joint Reconnaissance Center**

**Reference: J3M-585-61 dated 24 July 1961**

1. As mentioned in referenced memorandum, personnel of your Operations Center and the Joint Reconnaissance Center have been investigating means for providing a timely secure communications capability between the two centers.

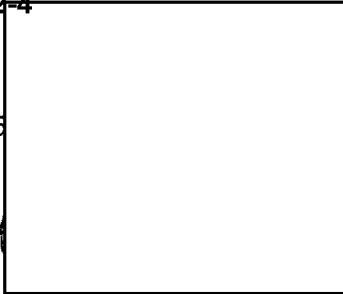
2. It is believed that the installation of a secure telephone drop on the Central Intelligence Agency "Red Telephone" system will provide the required capability. The present teletype system will be required for transmission of detailed data for record.

3. I recommend that action be taken to allocate a drop on the CIA Secure Telephone Net to the Joint Reconnaissance Center.

1. This Agency is conducting a review of the question of secure telephone communications from the new headquarters building in Langley, Virginia, to other departments and agencies in Washington. A link between the DPD operations center and the Joint Reconnaissance Center is one of those under consideration, but the question is not likely to be resolved until the Agency's operations center has actually moved to Langley.

2. In the meantime, secure telephone communications, using both the KY-1 and KY-11 systems, exist between various Agency offices and offices in the Department of Defense. For example, there is a KY-1 link between DPD and the office of the Special Assistant for Projects, the Inspector General, United States Air Force. Our personnel have been instructed to use these and other means to maintain timely communications between the two operations centers.

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
