You specifically approved the first of the above quoted sentences which leaves it open to you to propose a review of NSCID-3, and I have already forwarded to you a draft of a letter for your signature to Mr. Park Armstrong which would advise him that you intend to do so. The wording of the sentence on financing is designed to make possible an immediate start on expanded production while making it clear that the whole financing arrangement would be			
subject to review.			

3. I believe the recommendation is reasonably safe in this form. If,

however, you do not wish to write a letter to Mr. Streibert giving such a blanket approval, I recommend that I draft a different letter for you which would approve the conclusions and recommendations of the Survey with a reservation on one or both of the points to which I have here called your attention. Even such a qualified approval will cover the points in which Mr. Streibert's organization is urgently interested. If you wish such a letter drafted. will
