Morning Meeting of 18 January 1965

The current intelligence briefing included: cabinet shuffle in Saigon; Saragat's concern over the political situation in Italy; assassination of the premier in Burundi; the current lull in the military situation in the Congo may be over soon since the ANC has plans for attack on the rebels [redacted] more Soviet ships possibly enroute to Indonesia; mix-up on standard 90-day rotation of troops into Berlin; additional reports of truck movement in Laos on Route 7; an analysis [redacted] on Friday re [redacted]

DDI noted that the White House staff was currently mulling over two problems, (1) possibility that Ambassador Bowles might make an effort to better relations with Sihanouk, (2) Ambassador Jones suggestion that a meeting between the President and Sukarno might keep Indonesia from going Communist. He gave the undersigned three [redacted] reports which he thinks the DCI would be interested in. The EXDir instructed that following the perusal by the DCI they be made available to the DDCI, the ExDir, and the DDP. 25X1
