Houston noted that a meeting has been arranged with the Mahon subcommittee on 23 February. Among items to be discussed are the two most recent releases from the Agency reserve.

Houston noted that Senator Javits has joined those urging a Joint Committee on Intelligence but Javits refrained from attacking the Agency.

ADDP noted that we are still awaiting Koren's response to our request for a State Department view on the surfacing of a Hungarian defector before one of our subcommittees on the Hill.

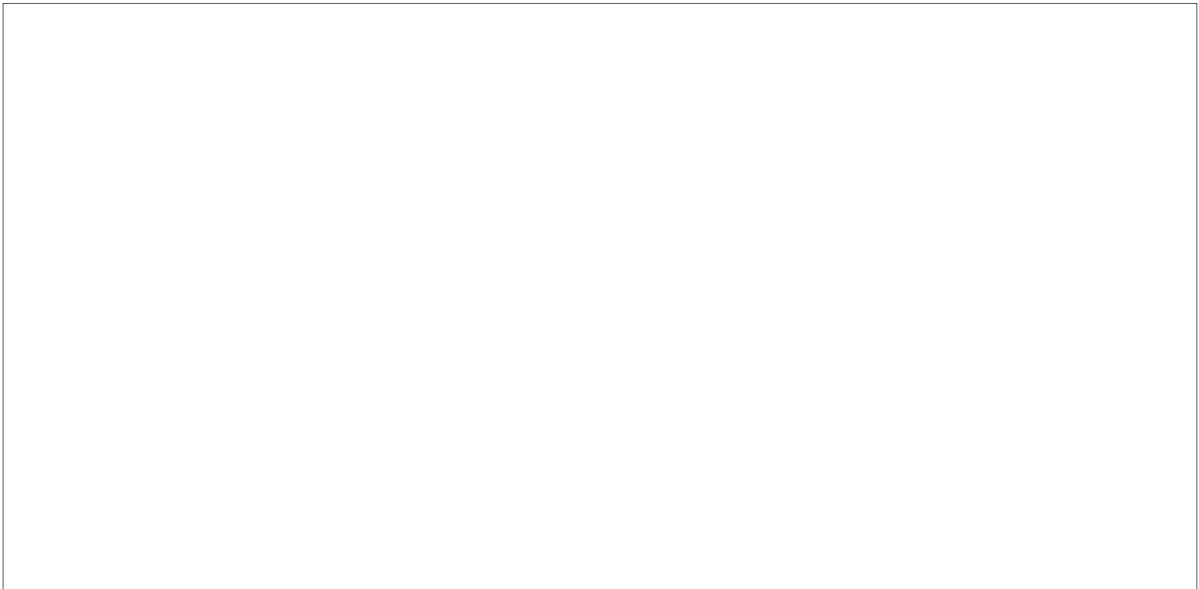
