Director's Meeting

Mr. Jackson reported that the Magnitude papers had gone forward from the USC to the JCS. Various JCS Indians are presently discussing the matter with Mr. [redacted]. DCI stated that he wants no more discussion and that the JCS can take it or leave it. He further stated that if there had to be discussion, it should be only with himself or the D/DCI and under no circumstances with O/PC.

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Mr. Jackson stated that the proposed LOOK article could be very troublesome and might even embarrass the government. There is a chance that Fritchey may be able to solve the matter. Mr. Jackson will talk to Col. Hansen in regard to Fritchey and will determine whether it is better to let him go ahead or whether the DCI should call Gardiner Cowles.

The DCI mentioned that he had a note from Ambassador Wiley in which Wiley stated that he was worried about what the [redacted] could and would do in the South. DCI wondered whether he should see the [redacted] leaders who are in this country. Mr. Dulles will check this and also speak to State about them.

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Mr. Jackson reported that Mr. [redacted] was coming in to see him this morning at 11:30. He suggested that it might be possible to have [redacted] in charge of the new ~~Communications~~ *Comm. Sec. Div.* Division.

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Mr. Dulles reported that [redacted] has arrived safely in Copenhagen.

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Mr. Dulles stated that he was very worried about Spain and believed that something unpleasant would happen this summer. The DCI asked him to get in touch with Gen. [redacted] immediately. Mr. Dulles also suggested that it might be well to get an [redacted]

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Mr. Dulles reported that he had a call from the Dean of Cal-Tech yesterday. They are having a conference in the near future on the west coast regarding electronics, psychological warfare, etc. Services and many institutions will be represented and Gen. McClure will be the first speaker. Mr. Dulles

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suggested that we might send someone to represent CIA. DCI agreed on the basis that the representative should listen and not talk. It may be possible for the Mr. Dulles will check.

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
