[redacted] briefly discussed the OPC Consultant's Meeting which he attended yesterday afternoon. He noted that [redacted] had given a brief resume of his recent trip to Europe and it appears that operational planning insofar as concerns Army, Navy, Air Force and SHAPE, is being done separately and apparently wholly uncoordinated. This situation places an additional burden upon our people in drafting plans ^{for} unconventional warfare. [redacted] also noted that General Haydon, who is General Sinclair's War Planner, was in town to discuss the whole problem of [redacted] in Europe.
